





Pat Mitchell Led us in our discussion of Hannah Ritchie's *Not the*



The sisters in the WEB Region gathered via Zoom on the feast of St. Josephine Bakhita which is the International Day of Prayer and Awareness against Human Trafficking. This was the focus of our prayer discussion. Several sisters have been very involved in raising awareness of Human Trafficking. Virgie told us of the sisters in Kenya whose ministries are to victims of trafficking and of the danger that Philippinas face if contracted to work in other countries. Janet recommended the app, Trafficking Cam, that is directed to uncovering victims in hotel rooms; she also suggested asking the hotel management if they signed the Code of Conduct. Trafficked victims are often too scared to leave their situations to seek help. Lynn recommended the documentary, Born into Brothels, that won an Oscar 20 years ago but is still relevant today; it can be found on YouTube. Roberta explained the difference between open and closed work permits: open means workers can move to other employment if their situation is an abusive one; under closed permits that is not possible. We shared a bit about the current crisis in the immigrant communities.

Loretta's parish has two congregations; one is Latino with their own liturgies and activities. The parish has declared all church property a safe place. Two of our Inquirers, Patience and Alice, signed their Affiliation Covenants and were affirmed by the region's Alleluia. On March 8, we celebrated International Women's Day and the beginning of the Lenten Season. Our discussion centered around the question: How creative will I be in interpreting the Lenten practices of Fasting, Prayer and

Almsgiving amid the suffering and chaos that surrounds us?

Among the practices suggested were:

- ❖ Lent this year feels like Cosmic Sadness and it calls for increased prayer, for caring for those around us, asking what we can do for them.
- Engage in Network's program, Fasting from Billionaires.
 - Call our congressional members to express our concerns. Join People's Union National boycott to protest stores that have discontinued DEI.
 - Contribute to organizations that support Democracy.
 - List the people who have helped us become who we are and thank them.
 - Meditate on nature, moving from church to the Cosmic Christ.
 - Renew International is promoting a six-week Lenten program called Journey of Hope with recommended actions.
 - Watch less news and social media; seek journalism that speaks truth.
 - Watch local, national and international news to get a wider perspective.
 - As alms, donate fresh produce to food pantries

In light of Pope Francis' recent illness, we responded to the question: What aspects of Francis' tenure have been most meaningful to me? Pope Francis was recognized for his courage in speaking truth to power, for his humility and apologies to people wronged by the church, for his focus on Vatican II

and shifting the emphasis from law to the human person.

The question arose concerning payment for the 2026 assembly. Will there be a source in the U.S. to collect funds and send them to the assembly team? The region followed up on the question later and contacted Deb Murphy who agreed to assume that role.

Sally Soules Life: 1941-2025 SFCC: 1978-2025

Our sister, Sally Soules "went Home to the Lord VERY PEACEFULLY on February 3. 2025, at 1:00 am." Sister Jean Bodart also writes, "She literally just slept her way into Heaven. Sally had a lifelong love for angels, and I can imagine the Lord bringing her home surrounded by her angels." All who knew and loved Sally can imagine the same.

Sally was born and raised in Michigan where she attended Catholic schools. She worked in the Accident and Health Claim department of an insurance company after high school, and in 1968 joined the Franciscan Sisters of Perpetual Adoration, remaining with them for 9 years, when she left and joined SFCC. In the spirit of SFCC, Sally said she "needed more freedom to move where the Spirit of God called."

She devoted her life to pastoral care and lived her favorite passage from Micah: "This is all the Lord asks of you: to act justly, love tenderly, and walk humbly with your God." Sister Jean notes "Sally really lived that in her pastoral ministry, even with strangers in the grocery store oy Dunkin' Donuts." Her initial contact with SFCC was Angelita Fenker, SFCC. Sally was an active member of the Koinonia Region for many years until she went with the splinter region, Anawim, in 2013. We mourn with members of both SFCC regions who suffer the loss of Sally in their lives.

RECOMMENDATIONS FOR 2026 ASSEMBLY

I recommend, with modifications from the Assembly floor, if any, that the registration fee for future Assemblies include the cost of an outside technology contractor to ensure that sisters joining the Assembly virtually have steady access.

Rationale: There are local companies in the US, EU, Africa and Philippines that have the correct updated equipment, will set up and monitor for reasonable fees for conferences such as ours. Those organizing future Assemblies need to include this as part of their planning and budgeting process.

I recommend, with modifications from the Assembly floor, if any, that regions hold interregional meetings at least once a year.

Rationale: As we look to the future, the annual Assembly will be held in countries that prohibit some of the sisters from attending due to age, the cost of travel and, in some cases, the cost of room and board. 


Veronica Thiga St. Rita Region. -Kenya Born on 1\2\1957 Gatitu parish
